The Past Floods Matter team are looking for past flood organisations and individuals to be involved with the project. If you or your organisation are interested in flood damage, water management or flood insurance, then we would like to hear from you.

How can my organisation get involved?

Sponsoring interviews/panels: We are interested in speaking to experts with experience of flood damage, and especially those who have memories of flood damage striking back several decades.

Sharing historic documentation or archives: We are interested in any historical documents that you hold or have access to that relate to flood damage, water management or flood control that is not yet available in publicly accessible archives.

Speaking with an expert on your organisation's current activities: We are keen to find flood organisations that are working in a particular flood risk, and who may wish to be involved with us in the future of our project's progress.

How will my organisation benefit?

By understanding flood risk in a long-term historical perspective: We aim to bring organisations involved with flood risk management into the long-term historical perspective of flooding in their region.

By being aware of past solutions to flood risk: We aim to explore the success and failure of historic flood risk management strategies, and to assess the viability of contributing effective historical practices.

By securing the legacy of your work: The project will be able to archive the history and knowledge of flood damage, water management and flood control practices by collecting and preserving oral histories and historical records, and by publishing research on these practices.
